Siblings in Christ,

John Wesley was never more inspiring than when his thoughts drifted toward the topic of a new birth. Although he was renowned for his preaching, the truth is that he could be dry, at times, scolding at other times, and even somewhat harsh or polemical, but when he preached about new birth his imagination soared and his rhetoric sailed to lofty heights. New birth, for him, signaled new possibility, fresh and bursting energy (powered by divine fuel cells!), movement and spiritual progress, an opportunity to lay life's heavy baggage aside and run forward joyfully and energetically with a newly-lightened load. For him, the potential of the newly born was virtually boundless—he was simply unwilling to short sell what the Spirit could do in a life even to the point of holding out perfection in love as a real human possibility. Such was the strength and force of Wesley's understanding of the Holy Spirit and the way She might unleash a new creation within a human heart.

It's interesting to me drawing near to Pentecost that, throughout his life, it was Wesley's *optimism* on this score that got him into the most trouble. He understood what Pentecost really means and he was unwilling to relent, unwilling to let human frailties and limitations confine the boundless wildness of the Spirit that breathes forth life into creation. In many ways his legacy is just this novel brand of humility—not so much the conventional humility that carefully manages our pretentions to progress against a more deeply-held spiritual pessimism, but a humility that shied away from putting constraints on how far the Spirit might take us.

This year as we arrive on Pentecost, I am challenged by the force of Wesley's Holy Spirit optimism. I wonder: do we shield ourselves from its claim on our lives with spiritual pessimisms of our own? Do we draw the lines around what is possible in us too narrowly and too conventionally? Is our imagination for ourselves and for our church not part of what needs to be born anew? I, for one, do not wish to go back and live my life over again—I don't wish to unknow what I know, undo my experiences, re-experience all of the growing pains and hard-learned lessons—but I do pray for the wonder and courage and silly optimism of

newborn life. That, I believe, is not only Wesley's but God's challenge to us all at Pentecost—to be born as God's church again in the Holy Spirit's wildfire. May it be so!

Lamplighters

The Parable of the Growing Seed Mark 4:26 thru 29. (NLT)

He also said "This is what the kingdom of God is like

A man scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. All by itself the soil produces grain first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

We have started a study of the parables. The first parable we studied was the parable of the T alents. A parable about service and obedience.

The second parable was the parable of the Gro wing Seed. A parable about the Kingdom of God.

We have about thirty more parables to study which will take us through the summer months.

Join us for this women's Bible Study on Wednesdays at 1 p.m. the Narthex.

The Bible often uses seeds as symbols of faith or God's Word. In the Old Testament, seeds also refer to offspring. Jesus said people who believe in him can perform mighty deeds with "faith the size of a mustard seed" (Luke 17:6, NRSV). Many of Jesus' teachings use seed imagery; for example, in the parable of the four soils, he said the seed, God's Word, can grow only when people hear it, "hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patient endurance" (Luke 8:15, NRSV).

Celebrating the church's birthday

On Pentecost, we remember when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples. As they gathered in Jerusalem 10 days after Jesus' ascension, they saw tongues of fire, heard rushing wind and began speaking in many languages. Because the disciples could then share the good news with all the pilgrims assembled for the Pentecost festival, the occasion marks the birthday of the Christian church. That day alone, about 3,000 people devoted their lives to Christ.

Like the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is important and relevant today. As theologian Henri Nouwen writes, "Without Pentecost the Christ -event — the life, death and resurrection of Jesus — remains imprisoned in history as something to remember, think about and reflect on. The Spirit of Jesus comes to dwell within us, so that we can become living Christs here and now."


