Siblings in Christ,

Christ Is Risen! As we move into the season of Easter this year, I wonder what it would churn up in us for each of us to keep that nagging 'is' of Easter morning before us: Christ Is Risen. The 'is' of Easter is a nagging 'is', I think, because it refuses to move from the present into the past tense—from 'is' to 'was'. The 'is' of Easter is always an 'is'. It refuses to let Easter be consigned to the past or put off until some undetermined future time. Christ is risen today! If we were to try and live with that nagging 'is' before us for awhile, I wonder what fruit that might yield.

I have a hunch that living with that 'is' might eventually lead us into taking a look for ourselves. If he is risen, where do we see him? Where do we see the reverberations of Easter, the ripples of resurrection? I'm going to be preaching a sermon series through this season called "The Places Where We've Seen Him" and I encourage you to step into that search with both feet and two eyes open.

Along those lines, I'd like to invite you to come and join us in our newly re-introduced Wednesday Potlucks. Those are a wonderful opportunity both to join together but also to have spiritual conversations like this. Easter is a season to explore God's new possibilities for us and for our world together and so I would like to introduce you to a book that I would like to begin reading with you later this month: L. Gregory Jones and Andrew Hogue, Navigating the Future: Traditioned Innovation for Wider Seas. This book, is about dreaming and travelling forward into the future; adapting to new times, but also taking the best wisdom of the past with us. With all of the things that face us moving ahead, this book shows us how to navigate those waters as an Easter people—with hope, confidence, faith, and joy. I hope you'll join me in this venture.


