There are a lot of things happening around the church to get the season going. Please let us know you're coming so that we can prepare a place for you. Later in the year we'll read a book recommended to us by Bishop Devadhar for this year: Brian Mclaren's Faith After Doubt: Why Your Beliefs Stopped Working and What to Do About It. As the title suggests, this is a book about faith and doubt and how doubt is, in fact, part of growing in faith. There's a lot to get plugged back into as we enter this Fall both in-person as well as remotely and we hope you'll find your place in our life in ministry as we prepare for the fresh breath of life and energy that a change in season can offer.


We will be supporting the Greater Nashua Cropwalk again this fall. Please see separate article in this edition. This may be a little early but time flies when doing mission work....





## Building Use Policy through COVID-19 Updated 08/2021

During this continuing time of concern over the COVID-19 pandemic, we at the church are continuing to monitor the situation locally, regionally, and nation-wide and update our building use policies in consultation with the guidance of the Annual Conference, the CDC, the state of NH, and local policy-making bodies (such as that being implemented in our local schools public schools). Pastor John, along with the MUMC Reopening Task Force comprised of members of our Trustees along with representatives from other executive committees and lay leadership, have created these policies with the intention that the church be a safe space to worship and gather in these times.

#### General Building-Use Policies:

Contact Tracing and Sign-In: We ask that anyone who enters the building during the week sign in with your name and contact information at the front desk unless you are a regular volunteer in the church office, employee, or part of a group that has been approved to keep attendance on a role. This is so that we can pursue the appropriate contact tracing steps in the case of a contagion event.

Small Group Gatherings During the Week: We are currently allowing small groups to meet inside the building Sunday-Thursday. The building will remain closed on Fridays and Saturdays except to cleaning staff and the sound booth team in order to filter the air sufficiently prior to Sunday worship. This includes musical rehearsals, Bible Studies, crafting, etc. We are not yet permitting non-church groups to gather within our building at this point in time and please note that this only applies to indoor gatherings.

Mask Policy for Indoor Building Use During the Week: We encourage everyone to continue to wear masks for your safety in public gatherings, especially in seasons when local numbers are high or on the rise. We are currently allowing regularly-meeting small groups that have been approved to keep their own attendance on a role to follow special procedures:

Attendance rolls should be faithfully kept for each meeting

Attendance rolls should include contact information for each participant as well as a note as to whether each member has been vaccinated. Small group members are asked to volunteer that information and it will be considered confirmed when the group leader or church office staff has signed off that they have seen a vaccination card. Once vaccination has been verified and signed off on once, we will no longer ask to see this information and we do not keep any private information on file.

Small groups whose attendance is fully vaccinated (i.e., 100%) and verified may gather indoors without masks, though we ask that you be sensitive to those present in your gathering and continue to use the safe practices outlined here.

Small groups that <u>do not</u> have a fully vaccinated and verified attendance should continue to meet with the entire group fully masked insofar as they gather indoors and should also continue to follow appropriate social distancing procedures

Newly-joining members of small groups should be asked the standard questions listed below under C ("Standard CDC Entry Questions")

All groups are asked to continue to make use of hygienic practices like washing hands and making use of our sanitization stations.

Hygienic Practices to Minimize the Spread of Germs: the church will continue to provide hand-sanitation stations with sanitizer, sanitizing wipes, and masks for your use. We ask that you make appropriate use of these while in the building and please let us know if our supply is running out.

Vaccination Policy: Our building use policy does not prevent unvaccinated persons from entering our building space at MUMC. However, it does seek to prevent persons who are experiencing symptoms from entering the building so that we may ensure the safety of this space as best as we are able. MUMC seeks to extend Christ's radical welcome to all people and to be a healing presence in our community as we open a space that is holy, wor-

shipful, and safe. We understand that some are not yet of age to receive a vaccine and that others have medical conditions that prevent them from getting it. We hope and intend that all will feel welcome and nurtured in our space and we aim to provide for ways to join into our gatherings and fellowship remotely (through livestream and Zoom) during this time.

#### **Sunday Worship Policies:**

Sanctuary Capacity: We are currently limiting the sanctuary capacity to 65 in the main seating area and 3 in the sound booth, in addition to the choir and those seated in the front staging area. We ask that verified vaccinated persons let us know if they might be willing to cluster their seating arrangements in 'pods' with those that you might interact with outside of church or might be otherwise comfortable sitting in close proximity to. This assists us to maximize our use of space while still abiding by the appropriate social distancing guidelines.

Reservations and Seating: We still ask that people who are planning to attend Sunday Service call the church office during the week to make a reservation <u>unless you are on the list of regular attenders</u>. In the latter case, your seat will be automatically reserved every week. The purpose of this policy is so that we can maintain our sanctuary capacity guidelines above and gain a clearer sense of when we might need to transition back to hosting 2 services. That said, we would rather you come than not if you forgot your reservation and we ask that you do attend if you are willing and able so that we can gain an accurate view of where the church is in their feelings on gathering as time moves forward.

Gathering and Greeting on Sunday Morning: When you arrive you will have a seat waiting for you with a name-tag on your seat. If you have indicated that it is okay with you to be seated in a cluster, we will gather those seats together before you arrive and have your seat waiting for you.

Mask Policy for Worship: We will continue to require masks for Sunday morning worship because of the larger crowd size and the mixed nature of our gathering in terms of vaccination status. Those speaking at pulpits and lecterns or singing on stage may use the clear face shields while on the stage area.

Singing in Worship: Music, singing, and offering our gifts and voice to the Lord are a central of the experience of Christian worship and of our Methodist tradition of being a people of song. We will offer congregational opportunities to sing hymns (masked) and are allowing the choir and other musical groups to perform on stage. Musical groups may sing live with masks of face-shields or record their pieces in their weekly rehearsals for show on Sunday mornings (using the mask policies appropriate to small group gatherings.

The Sacrament of Baptism: We are conducting baptisms. Because the recipient is often an infant and these occasions frequently draw guests, we also offer to do them in outside settings or in gatherings outside of Sunday morning worship according to your comfort level. When done indoors or as part of Sunday morning worship, the policies outlined here will apply.

The Sacrament of Holy Communion: We currently celebrate holy communion on the first Sunday of every month. For most of the worship service until we come to the time of sharing, the bread and grape juice will remain covered: the grape juice will be pre-poured into individual cups and remain in the communion ware (as usual) and the bread will remain under cloth cover until the Great Thanksgiving is offered. We will also make gluten free crackers available as well as pre-package, sealed "wafer and juice" packages and you are free to partake in whatever way is most comfortable to you.

Sanitization: the pastor will sanitize his hands before touching the communion elements.

Distributing the bread and cup: the pastor with tear and distribute the bread into your open hands. We ask that you allow the pastor and assistants to place the bread and cup in your hands in such a way that they may continue to distribute the bread safely.

Receiving Communion "In One Kind": if you are uncomfortable, for example, receiving the bread but are comfortable drinking the cup then you may still participate in the celebration of the meal. Just indicate this to the Pastor when you come to receive.

Extending the Table: Pastor John will be at the church on communion Sundays between 12pm-1pm for anyone participating in the service remotely that would like to receive. Pastor John will also bring communion to you if you notify him with a phone call or email.

Virtual Communion: we discourage the practice of taking communion on your own in front of a screen remotely at home. Communion is a community celebration at its heart. We seek to preserve the sharing aspect of

communion as well as its deeply incarnational and inter-personal character.

Standard CDC Entry Questions (modified for Use at MUMC):

Have you experienced any of the following symptoms in the past 48 hours: fever or chills; nausea; cough; headache; diarrhea; congestion or runny nose; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; sore throat; new loss of taste or smell muscle or body aches? (yes/no)

If 'Yes': If you have had any of the above symptoms in the last 48 hours (or within 48 hours of church), DO NOT request to come to church until symptoms have subsided for more than 48 hours. If you have a chronic medical condition that causes COVID-19-like symptoms and you want to attend church, please obtain medical documentation from your primary care physician to determine whether you can safely be granted access to the church. Fully vaccinated individuals should also not access campus if they are currently experiencing any of the above symptoms.

Are you isolating or quarantining because you tested positive for COVID-19 or are worried that you may be sick with COVID-19? (yes/no)

If you have concerns about being exposed to or sick with COVID-19, please stay home and self-quarantine or isolate.

Are you fully vaccinated OR have you recovered from a documented COVID-19 infection in the last 3 months? To be considered fully vaccinated, you must be  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series or  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine? (yes/no)

If 'Yes': Would you be willing to bring your vaccination card with you to church so that the church can verify how many of its members and attendees have been vaccinated? No information will be taken down and it will be kept private. This will help the church to make decisions about how to conduct Sunday gatherings and monitor building use. (yes/no)

Have you been in close physical contact in the last 14 days with a) anyone who is known to have laboratory-confirmed COVID-19, or b) anyone who has any symptoms consistent with COVID-19? (yes/no)

Close physical contact is defined as being within 6 feet of an infected/symptomatic person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 48 hours before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic individuals, 48 hours prior to test specimen collection).

If you have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19, you should stay home and self-quarantine for 14 days before returning to the church

Are you currently waiting on the results of a COVID-19 test? (yes/no)

IMPORTANT: ANSWER "NO" IF YOU ARE WAITING ON THE RESULTS OF A PRE-TRAVEL OR POST-TRAVEL COVID-19 TEST

Have you traveled in the past 10 days? (yes/no)

Travel is defined as any trip that is overnight AND on public transportation (plane, train, bus, Uber, Lyft, cab, etc.) OR any trip that is overnight AND with people who are not in your household.
