CROP Walk Report

Sunday May 15th, CROP Walk Day, as you all remember, was a dismal, rainy day for a six mile walk. Nevertheless, 256 brave and hardy people, from 5 and 6 to 86, came out to join the Walk. Less than half, 105 by my records, completed the entire circuit. About a dozen people actually came to St. Patrick to drop off a Sponsor Envelope, but decided not to walk at all. Who can blame them?

In terms of the size of the walk compared to 374 last year, the 2011 Walk was about 68% as large. We have had 350 or more the last 4 years, and the 2006 Walk was 298. So this year stands as a major "dip" in the graph. The explanation is obvious. But despite the lower turn-out in numbers, this Walk had great spirit! Those who walked this year can take extra pride in truly sharing in a tiny bit of the hardship experienced daily by nearly a billion people living on this earth with us. Get-

Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends,

June is graduation month, and as such it is a month of transitions and celebrations, a time of bittersweet emotions as we mark the passing of one stage of life and anticipate the possibilities of a new stage. I am particularly aware of that reality this year, as my wife and I will be celebrating our daughter's graduation from high school. What a jumble of emotions we are feeling! One moment I am overflowing with pride, and the next I am choked up with grief at the impending loss of my daughter's childhood. We work so hard to get to this point, and yet when it arrives we don't want to let go.

Of course, our daughter is going through her own set of emotions as well. Some of them seem designed to make it as easy as possible for her to say goodbye to us, and for us to say goodbye to her. That is not surprising, given the enormity of the change that she is about to undergo. But then there are those other times when an expression of gratitude slips out, or a hug is exchanged and we see that she is just as conflicted about her impending independence as we are.

Nothing is simple, is it? Nothing is ever a complete gain--there is always loss in the gaining--one door opening usually means another door closing. One option taken means other options refused or left behind. No wonder,

then, that at those times of highest celebration, when we think we ought be feeling unalloyed happiness, instead we feel so many different emotions--joy, sadness, satisfaction, stress, anger, laughter, tears. It is not easy, this process of celebration!

It is in these times when our hearts are full to overflowing that we fully appreciate the complexity of our lives. Hopefully we also become more aware of God's presence and companionship, rejoicing when we rejoice, sorrowing when we sorrow, and holding us up when we really don't know what we are feeling. We may be tempted to judge ourselves for feeling things we don't think we should feel, but God is not. He is simply there, gently holding and accepting all the contradictory emotions and feelings that are fleeting their way through our hearts.

May God go with you through the transitions of your life--the comings and the goings, the beginnings and the endings, the openings and the closings--and may you know that, whatever your are feeling, God is there.

- plastic drop cloths

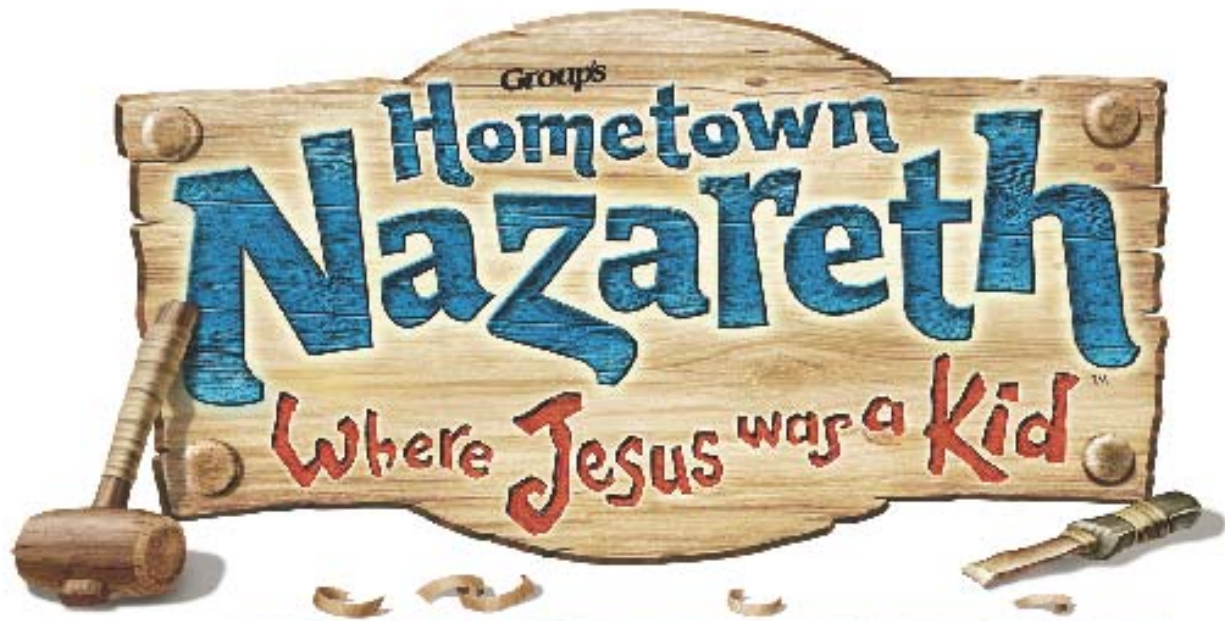

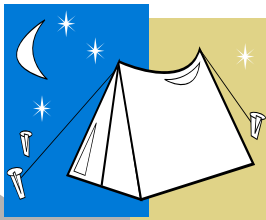

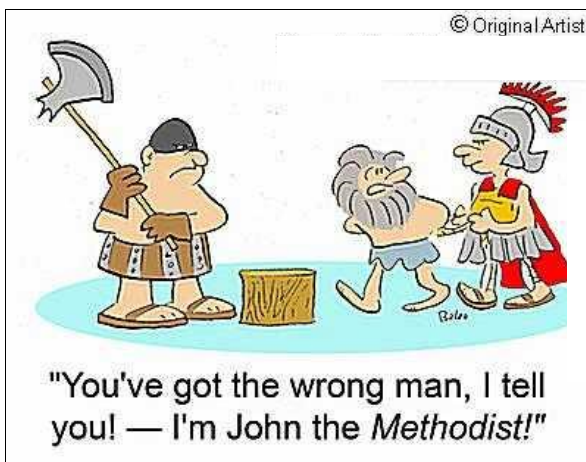
Please contact the Randlett's at 672-4997 if you are able to join us for this fun evening. It helps for us to know just how many will be coming for setting up of the tables. Thank you!

ting wet in 56 degree weather is the least of their worries!

Financially, however, rolling up the pledges reported at Registration, a total of \$36,000 is statistically within reach. This would be only about 10% less than last year. If this turns out to be true, we can definitely call the 2011 CROP Hunger Walk a success!

Many people still have pledge envelopes to turn in. I trust no one feels obligated to return a pledge just because they didn't actually walk. Those pledges were made for the cause of the Walk. As individuals, we merely gave them the opportunity to donate. Another factor which increasingly troubles the prediction of a final number is that pledges collected on-line may or may not be included in what people report at check-in. So we shall see. Sponsor Envelopes may be dropped off at SHARE, or given to me via Andrea in the office at the Congregational Church of Amherst (make sure you actually hand them to Andrea). Also, checks may be made to "CWS/CROP" and mailed to our Walk Treasurer, Paula Schmida, at 34 Thornton's Ferry Rd. #1, Amherst, NH 03031.

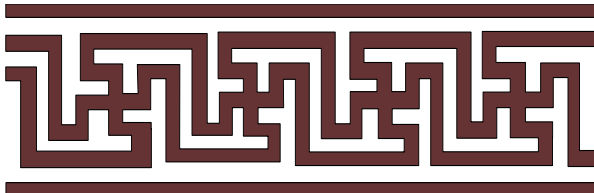

We hope everyone is enjoying the new tablecloth and runners in the Narthex. It was great that they arrived in time for Easter!

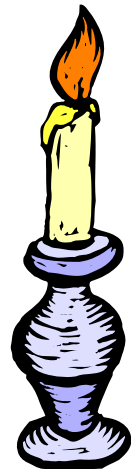
