Renewal Leave for Pastor Tom

Ever wonder what it might be like to do the job of a pastor? Imagine making hospital visits several days a week to people you know and have a relationship with, getting phone calls from these same people who are in crisis at any time of the day or night, having to keep your attitude positive and spirits high, maintain your patience, give up your family time at the drop of a hat, miss a birthday or concert or other family function, keep so many confidences that you just might burst from that load alone, and being held to a "higher" standard by all those you have in your pastoral care.

When Googling "What's it like to be the Pastor of a Church" the return was an article by Dale A. Robbins writing for *Ministry Health*. This article touches on some of these things and also notes some great challenges that pastor's face.

Being misunderstood: This

section states that being a pastor is not a job, it's what the person is. Even in the safety and relative separation of his home, most of his actions and conversations have something to do with the church.

Another is **coping with criticism...**

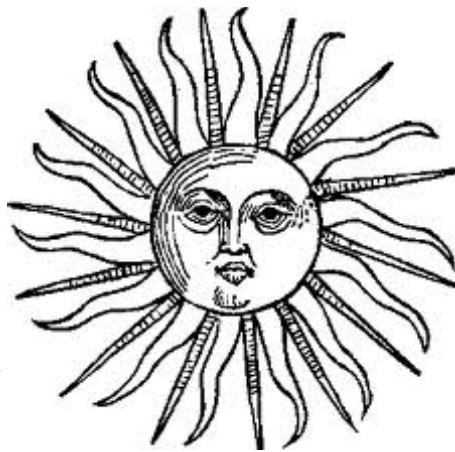
h m m m , ever criticize the Pastor??

ever try to influence the Pastor and get just a bit upset if the outcome was not what you wanted?

How about **coping with emotional conflict?** During a

single day a pastor could go from consoling someone with a terminal illness, listening to trivial complaints, meeting with a couple to discuss marriage plans, to correcting someone for their sinful lifestyle...how does one keep their composure from all these concerns and still manage to preach an encouraging heartfelt sermon to the congregation on Sunday? Many of us might become hardened after this kind of emotional upheaval but through all of this we all

Dear Friends,

This month we will be launching our annual stewardship campaign. This

I promise that you will grow spiritually through this campaign if you are open to it. Because this campaign is not about what MUMC needs to receive from its members and friends. It is about our need to give, and the blessings that await us as we commit a portion of our financial resources to God and his work through the church. This campaign is not about raising money, but raising our faith.

So, I invite you to get ready to be blessed. Get ready to have the windows of heaven opened and to have all of God's best pouring down on you. "Open the Windows," and see what happens!

expect the Pastor to be sensitive and compassionate and feel our hurts and share our burdens.

How about disappointment? Being judged or spoken against... what disappointment that is for any of us. How about the disappointment of losing a beloved member of the flock to death or relocation? That can be a heart-breaking disappointment for the Pastor and the congregation so we can all relate to that one.

Through all these challenges, how many times did the Pastor respond with an open heart and open mind to our questions, requests or hurting hearts? Even if you have not had to call on him for that or if your expectations were not always fully met, I believe we can all site times when we or someone we know or love were shown the love and care that was expected from the still fully human person we call Pastor.

So all that said, our Methodist practice allows us to approve a time of renewal for our Pastor. A time when he can leave the challenges behind; a time when he can breath the air of life given by his family, where he can let his guard down and just be that human being who is loved and nurtured by the same Christ we depend on, a time when he can be dad and husband and friend, free of the heavy burdens that a pastor

carries. It has been at least seven years since Pastor Tom last received a time of renewal.

To support the well-being of our Pastor, SPR, Ad Council, and Finance have approved a renewal leave for Pastor Tom starting July 4, 2011 through August 31, 2011. This leave includes his regularly scheduled vacation time as well as his yearly week at Wanakee.

A Renewal Leave Committee has been busy meeting to plan a summer schedule full of fun and opportunities for relationship building with a theme of "Old Home Days". With the help of Pastor Tom we have a list of guest pastors as well as lay folks from our own congregation ready to "gift" you with their own version of heartfelt encouraging messages through this eight week period and another set of qualified pastors to provide any needed pastoral care that is beyond the scope of our Lay Leaders and Ministry Director.

Included in our plans are fellowship breakfasts between services every Sunday in that time frame, two Saturday Night at the Movies events, Vacation Bible School, and the annual Church Picnic. As of this writing, we are still making plans. We hope that you will catch the excitement and make a special effort to connect with your church family through this time.

The Renewal Leave Committee is also aware that this separation from our

During the month of March, there were 188 standard household appointments, providing food for 549 individuals. There were 17 new households in March. There were also 26 emergency food appointments, serving 61 individuals. These are clients who are unable to wait for a standard appointment. They receive a 2-day supply of basic food staples to hold them over. Three new households called for Emergency Food. There were also 27 emergency requests for baby items, mostly diapers and 9 requests for toiletries. So you can see, your donations are needed and are important!

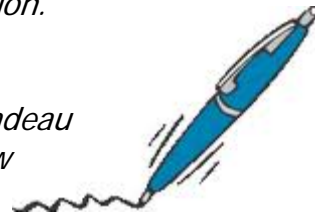
