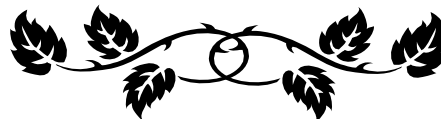

A Message from the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

It may be hard to fathom, especially for those of us who have been around MUMC for a while, but we have been worshiping in our North River Road facility for a little over 5 years now. Can you believe it? It's an awful cliché, I know, but it really does seem like just yesterday when we held our first services at the new building five years ago. And yet, an awful lot of things have happened in that time.

When we opened the door to our new building to the public for the first time, I don't know if we knew exactly what we were in for. I'm not sure we completely understood that we were at the same time opening the door to a new era in the life of our church—an era of increased opportunities for service, witness, visibility, and vitality. If I can be forgiven for tooting our horn a little bit, since our doors have opened, worship attendance at our services has increased by 35%, and we are now the 10th largest church in our conference in terms of weekly attendance. During that same time, church membership has increased by 38%, and we have received 176 new members. And of course, significant new ministries such as home groups, Afternoon Off, youth and adult mission trips, and our annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner have been added to the already existing menu of opportunities for service and growth in


discipleship.

All of this means that we have a lot to celebrate. To that end, I hope you are planning to join us on Sunday, October 9 for our 5th Anniversary Celebration. During our worship services that day, we will be setting aside some time to give thanks to God for an awesome 5 years here on North River Rd. Not only do we hope that you will be there, we also hope that some of our former members and friends will be there to celebrate with us. We'll spend time in each service looking back and remembering, and we will also gather for a reception after the 10:45 service. Plan now to be there!

In addition, whether you are newcomer to MUMC or a long time member, perhaps you have some words of thanksgiving, celebration, or gratitude you would like to share with the congregation. Please feel free to share those thoughts with me by e-mailing them to pastor@milfordumc.org, and we will try to find a way to include them in our services or during the reception.

I look forward to seeing you at our Anniversary Celebration on October 9!

Online Contributions to MUMC

Sunday morning, scrambling to get the kids dressed and out the door. Searching for the weekly giving envelope and the checkbook. Rushing out the door, writing a check in the car, or worse yet, in the church.

Has this ever happened to you? What if there was a way to set your weekly giving to the church and make your offerings hassle free? If you have online bill-pay with your bank, that way is here. Most of us are using online banking in some form or another and this is an opportunity to take one more item off of your list each week. It's fast and easy and doesn't cost you, or the church, anything.

MUMC will have a steadier cash flow for use in the mission of the church. With the electronic bill-pay feature, the bank will mail a check each week (or month) to MUMC on your behalf. This lets the Financial Secretary get the funds deposited in a timely manner and allows the church to better fulfill its mission. In these tough economic times, steady cash flow for the church is critical to MUMC being able to continue to help the community.

So, sign up with your bank today. It's free, simple, and tremendously beneficial for both you and the church! All the details are provided in the box at right.

How to Make Online Banking Contributions to MUMC

Specify to your bank:

- Weekly or monthly
- The day of the week or month
 - The "paid to" (MUMC)
 - The dollar amount
- The "memo" line (optional)
For example: the envelope number or whether the contribution is for the general fund, building fund, etc.

The bank will then write a check for the specified amount and the day you have chosen. The check is mailed to MUMC, with no cost to you for the postage. The amount is automatically deducted from your checking account.

MUMC receives your check in the mail and confidentially records your contribution.

For the month of October MUMC is collecting: cereal, paper towels, and toilet paper.



Can't believe summer is on its way out and autumn is just around the corner. Hope you have enjoyed a wonderful summer.

We are still asking for toilet paper from everyone as it is a necessity that we go through quickly. The pantry continues to be busy. Here are the statistics for the month of August:

- 193 standard household appointments, providing food for 582 individuals (a week's worth of food)
- 19 new households--first time coming to the Pantry
- 27 emergency food appointment, providing food for 84 individuals (2 day supply of food)
- 14 emergency requests for diapers

Thank you for your important support of the SHARE Food Pantry.

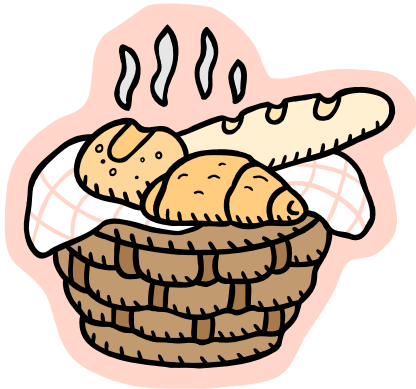
